GOSPEL: Matthew 21:28-32

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: "What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He came to the first and said, 'Son, go out and work in the vineyard today.' He said in reply, 'I will not,' but afterwards changed his mind and went. The man came to the other son and gave the same order. He said in reply, 'Yes, sir,' but did not go. Which of the two did his father's will?" They answered, "The first." Jesus said to them, "Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you. When John came to you in a way of righteousness, you did not believe him; but tax collectors and prostitutes did. Yet even when you saw that, you did not later change your minds and believe him."

PRAYING FOR THE SYNOD: In this September's copy of the Eastern Oklahoma Catholic, there's an article by Ken Coughlin, "Conversation in the Spirit: A process, not an event". The gathering referred to in the article will begin with an ecumenical prayer vigil on September 30 in St. Peter's Square, led by the Taizé Community, followed by a 3 day retreat for the participants (October 1-3). After the retreat, participants will begin the work of prayerful discussions, October 4-29, with a 2nd session planned for October 2024.

The prayer below has been printed in various forms for the Synod, and is printed on the United States Catholic Bishops website (attributed to Saint Isidore of Seville)

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts; Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions.

Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen.
